- Class 1: In hand hunter youngstock (3 years and under)
- Class 2: In hand hunter pony
- Class 3: In hand hunter horse – 4 years and over
- Class 4: In hand small hunter not exceeding 158cm
- Class 5: In hand large hunter - exceeding 158cm
- Class 6: Ridden small show hunter - 4 years and over, not exceeding 158 cm.
- Class 7: Ridden large show hunter - 4 years and over exceeding 158 cm

Mountain and Moorland

- Class 8: In hand registered / unregistered (may split if entries suffice)
- Class 9: Ridden registered / unregistered (may split if entries suffice)

Class 12: OPEN WORKING HUNTER Height of jumps 95 cms approx.

Class 17: Lead rein * Riders 4 – 7 years old

Class 18: Best ridden 8 – 11 years

Class 19: Best ridden 12 – 15 years

Class 20: Riding club horse * above 14'2hh must be ridden in a snaffle bridle no spurs.

Class 21: In hand riding pony / Horse * will split if entries suffice.

Class 22: Ridden riding pony / horse * will split if entries suffice.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY Please read carefully in advance of the competition and keep for reference.

Entries via horse monkey

The judges' decision is final.

No horse to have competed in a HOYS or RIHS Qualifier in the last 24 months.

Horses/Ponies must be 4 yrs and over unless otherwise stated next to class.

All animals must be sound.

All dogs must be kept on a leads and please clean up after your dog.

Beaglers, Top hats and bowlers are no longer acceptable.

All persons when riding must wear a properly fitted hat with 3 point straps which conforms to British Standards and must be properly dressed in correct clothing.

Although every effort has been made to run classes to schedule Glasgow Group RDA will not be held responsible for classes clashing.

Where sufficient entries are forward classes maybe split.

Any animal found to be suffering from a contagious or infectious disease will be asked to leave the centre immediately.

Objections to be lodged in writing within 30mins of the event concerned to the secretary with the sum of £10, which will be refunded if the objection is upheld by the Board of Directors.

The centre reserves the right to refuse entry. Entries must include the correct fees.

Any competitor, rider, groom or handler who acts in an abusive or aggressive manner towards any animal, spectator, official, volunteer or member of staff will forfeit all entries and/ or prizes and will be asked to leave the centre.

Two or more competitors may not compete on the same Horse/Pony in the same class.

Glasgow Group Riding for The Disabled, or anyone acting on their behalf, will not be held responsible for any damage or injury to vehicles or horses however caused.

Entries will only be given at the Boards discretion.
